Looking Ahead

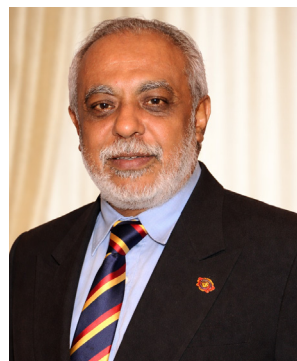
The Royal Selangor Club stands at an important moment in its history.

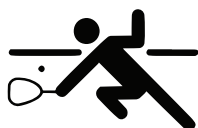

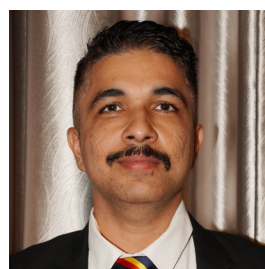

Honey lime chicken

Chef Azrah Kamalaasri is a renowned Malaysian chef, author, culinary teacher, and food consultant specialising in Southeast Asian cuisine and vegetarian dishes.



INGREDIENTS

1 chicken (cut into big pieces) }
2 tbsp of Cukup Rasa }
1 big onion (ground finely) } seasoning
1 egg white (slightly beaten) }

3 pips of garlic (chopped finely)
2 cups oil for frying
3 tbsp self-raising flour
2 green and 2 red chillies (sliced thickly)

Ingredients for the sauce:

3 tbsp of chilli sauce
3 tbsp of sugar
3 tbsp soya sauce
3 tbsp honey
½ tsp salt
2 ½ tbsp of cornflour (diluted with ¼ cup water)
Juice of 4 limes

METHOD

1. Marinate the chicken pieces with the above seasoning for 2 hours.
2. Rub the chicken pieces with self-raising flour and deep fry in oil until golden brown, drain and keep aside.
3. Remove all the above oil, leaving 3 tbsp oil, add in the chopped garlic and fry until brown.
4. Add in the mixed sauce and keep stirring constantly, when the sauce is boiling add in the green and red chillies and the fried chicken pieces and stir well until all the chicken pieces are well coated with the sauce.
5. Fry further 2–3 minutes, dish out and serve hot.

BRIDGE

Competitive vs Social Bridge

Bridge is a sport recognised under the Sports Development Act 1997 (amended 2023) and World Bridge Federation is also a member of the International Olympic Council, although it is commonly referred to as a game as well.

It is one of the cheapest activities to take up, all it takes is a pack (or two) of cards, four chairs and a table, sometimes not even that for the diehards who may play sitting on the floor. It also transcends all ages and may be played from 8 to 80 or even older, as testified by the many seniors who are playing regularly, and has been proven to be an education tool in teaching social skills, calculation and teamwork, and slowing down dementia for the elderly.

As in many other sports/games, bridge may be played competitively or socially. There is no distinction on which is better, they are not mutually exclusive and it all depends on the individual player which game gives them more enjoyment. Some players may like to play competitively most of the time, while others prefer the social environment in a more relaxed atmosphere. Most players can switch easily between the two, although probably easier for the competitive player to play socially than vice versa.

In social bridge, one deals the cards, bid and play the hand, keep score and do not compare their scores with anyone else. There is thus the element of luck, one will of course do well with a good hand than a poor hand. In competition, the players all play the same hands, by replacing the cards after play into a "board", serially numbered. It is commonly referred to as duplicate bridge because the hands are duplicated across the field. The element of luck is largely eliminated as everyone will be playing the same hands. Each pair's result is compared with those of every other pair sitting in the same direction, marks are given for the top score down to the bottom score. There may be as few as two tables to compare, or up to hundreds of tables such as in large tournaments. A lot more equipment is needed for competition, such as the duplicate boards, bidding boxes and sometimes a dealing machine and scoring devices. There are also different events in competitive bridge; clubs in Malaysia play pairs almost exclusively though there may be inter-club team events. Finally there are also individual events where every player partners a different player each round but this is thought more of as a "fun" event.



Bridge philosophy

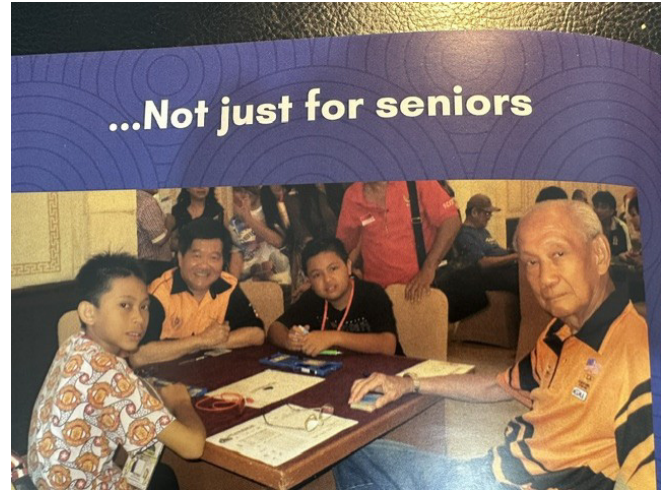
Bridge is played competitively at the RSC following the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017. An average of twenty-six boards will be played for every weekly game (meant to take 3 ½ hours plus a break for tea if any) with between 10 to 12 tables. As it is an organised event, there are rules, proper etiquette and strict timing to be followed to make it more enjoyable for the players. There is also a Director appointed to run and rule the game, whereas none is needed for a social game. In many clubs where there is a dedicated Card Room, duplicate bridge may be played on some designated days, while members are free to use the room to play socially whenever it is available.

When one is just learning to play, it can be quite daunting to be confronted with a lot of rules and regulations and a time limit. Some new players find the transition too fast after perhaps just undergoing very basic lessons, and are put off and give up the game. This is unfortunate as there is so much pleasure to be derived by persistence. Perhaps the transition can be made more palatable by slowly introducing the concept of duplicate bridge, having a separate table(s) during the weekly games without being thrown into the deep end to start with.

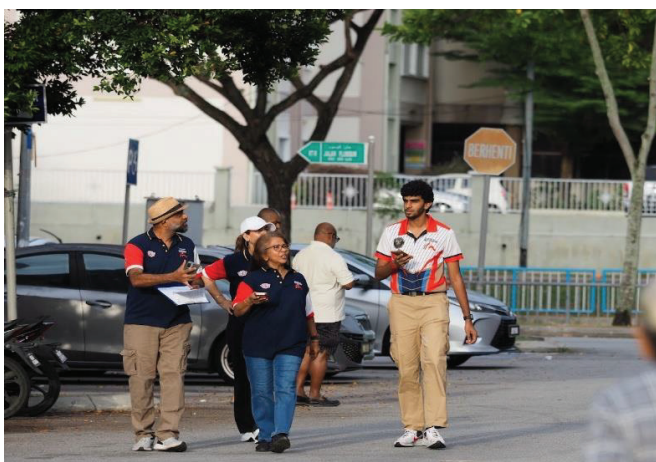
The celebrations continued into the evening at

With pre-season momentum building, the K9s looked to combine youthful energy with growing structure and discipline. The match promised intensity, physicality, and valuable lessons.

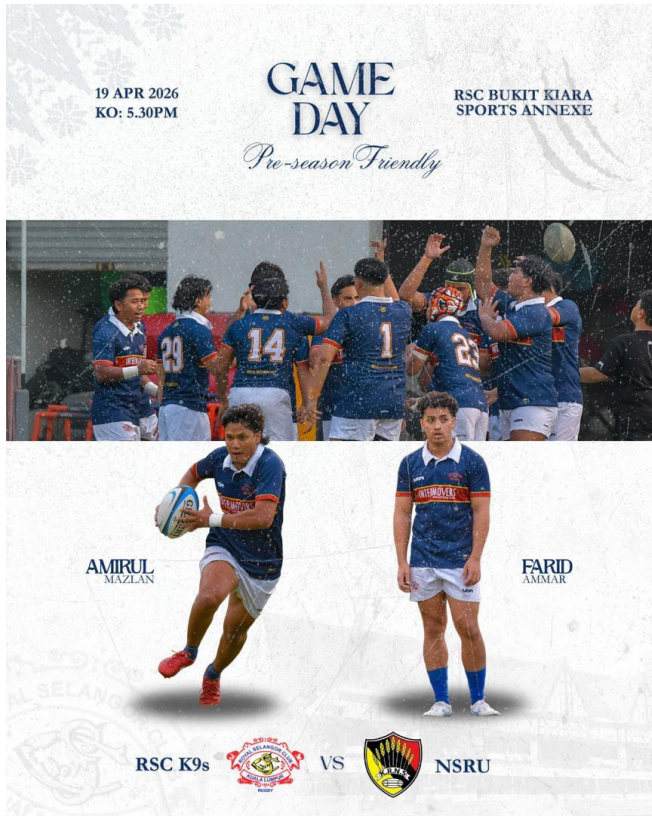
