Financial Year Audit

The Club's external auditors are poring over the accounts to produce the Audit report for FYE 2024/2025 in time for the AGM in December 2025. The General Manager is leading the Audit with the Finance manager, addressing the many queries and clarifications. We are awaiting the Audit report for review and approval.

Tenders and Contracts

The Club tendered out for procurement of two key services, i.e.

- 1. Procurement of Security Services
- 2. Procurement of Outsourced Manpower Services

The Club issued ITBs for the procurement of the above Services. The Club's Management Evaluation Team reports that in coordination with Tender Board, it undertook evaluation and shortlisted qualified Bidders based on a set of evaluation criteria. The Management Evaluation Team states that it has conducted reviews with interviews and records are taken into account.

In line with the Club's Constitution, the Club's Evaluation Team submitted its recommendations to

Tender Board for review and endorsement for onward submission to the GC for review and approval.


The GC approved the awards of both the Security Services and Outsourced Manpower Services based on the evaluation and recommendations by the Management Evaluation Team and Tender Board.

Cost Optimisation Initiatives:

Through various initiatives, the Club has reduced the procurement of Outsourced Manpower supplies from 35 personnel in 2024 to 25 personnel in 2025 (going forward).

The Club anticipates to save substantial amount of monies from both (a) the reduction of Number of personnel required and (b) lower manpower rates arising from competitive and transparent open bidding.

We thank the Management Evaluation Team for complying with the Club's competitive tendering process to strengthen the Club's financial position and operational efficiency.

Unseen dividends from hosting the 47th Asean Summit

With the most anticipated and impactful day of the 47th ASEAN Summit now successfully concluded, much of the public discourse, especially in KL and PJ, had initially focused on the easily quantifiable: the tight security, the inevitable traffic disruptions, and, perhaps most prominently, the final cost of logistics and hospitality. While we welcomed the impressive lineup—from President Donald Trump and China's Vice Premier He Lifeng to Japan's first female Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi—it was tempting to calculate only the immediate diplomatic return.

Yet, the true, enduring value of hosting this historic gathering would lie not in the official deliverables, but in the realm of the unseen—a phenomenon best explained by the Law of Unintended Consequences. These moments were exemplified right from the start, thanks to the engaging hosting by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, who carried out his task exceedingly well and impressed all who met him. US President Donald Trump, visibly entertained by the cultural dancers after getting off Air Force One at KLIA, broke into his famous dance move—pumping his fist and swinging his hips—to the delight of the VVIPs. A beaming Anwar sportingly joined in to add to the merriment. These light-hearted, unrehearsed happenings certainly added to the magic moments of Trump's visit to Malaysia.

While critics focused on the monetary cost, organisers needed to look to the long-term, unquantifiable benefits that would shape our nation's trajectory for years to come. The eyes of the world were on our nation, and this was a defining moment for Malaysia.

The Great Global Re-Branding: Diplomatic Capital Unpriced

The primary goals of the Summit were always diplomacy, trade, and regional cooperation—the intended consequences. But the far more profound benefit, I believed, was the instant, credible validation of Malaysia on the world stage. Hosting smoothly—managing the logistics, security, and complex protocol required for such high-level figures—did more than just bolster the government's reputation. It signalled to the world that Malaysia is a mature, stable, and highly capable nation. This competence was a form of sovereign credibility that no advertising campaign could ever buy.

The sheer scale of the global spotlight was something to behold: 2,854 media personnel from 290 agencies were accredited to cover the event. These were not just reporters covering official speeches; they were living and breathing in Kuala Lumpur for several days. They were experiencing our infrastructure, eating our food, navigating our multiracial landscape, and preparing to convey these direct, first-hand impressions back to billions of readers and viewers globally.

This was essentially a multi-billion dollar, high-credibility global media campaign gifted to us free of charge.

I had lived and studied in the United States for six years, and I knew firsthand how little many Americans knew about Malaysia. This Summit, I felt, would change that. When President Trump and his delegation set foot on our soil, when major broadcasting networks such as ABC, NBC and CBS filed stories from our capital, and when global leaders spoke of Malaysia with admiration—our visibility was set to soar. This was how nations rise in the global imagination: through presence, performance, and perception.

A Catalyst for Trade, Tourism, and National Pride

Beyond media exposure, we foresaw a powerful "unintended" tourism, trade and investment dividend. Many visiting leaders, delegates, entrepreneurs, and journalists would experience Malaysia for the first time. They were expected to dine on our nasi lemak and char kuey teow, admire our multiracial harmony, and discover that Malaysia truly was "Asia in miniature." When they return home, they would carry with them not just business cards but memories—stories of a warm, vibrant, and welcoming nation. Word of mouth, as every marketer knew, was priceless.

The leaders, ministers, senior officers, and private sector entrepreneurs accompanying them represented the highest-value familiarization group a country could ever wish for. This exposure was the critical first step in placing Malaysia firmly on their radar, translating directly into potential future Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), trade and, most importantly, increased employment opportunities for Malaysians. The event was poised to act as a massive prelude to Visit Malaysia 2026, beaming images of our world-class facilities and efficient organization globally.

Ultimately, the act of successfully hosting the ASEAN Summit positioned Malaysia as a bridge-builder and a voice of moderation and reason in a divided world. The success of convening the world's most powerful personalities could not be captured on balance sheets, but it would undeniably shape our national confidence.

This was an investment and a down-payment on a more prosperous, prominent, and respected position for Malaysia in the decade ahead.

Ayam masak merah

INGREDIENTS

1.2 kg chicken (cut into 14 pieces)

1tsp turmeric powder

2 big onions

dried chillies (soaked in hot water) 30g

10 pips garlic

1-inch shrimp paste (belacan)

1-inch galangal (lengkuas)

2 tbsp tomato paste

2 stalks lemon grass (bruised) 100g thick tamarind juice

kaffir lime leaves & Vietnamese coriander (daun kesum)

Sugar and salt to taste

Oil for frying

METHOD

1. Cut slits in the chicken pieces. Rub in the turmeric powder and $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp of salt. Set aside for 30 minutes to

} -- grind together

- 2. Heat oil in a pot. Fry the chicken pieces till golden brown. Drain and set aside.
- 3. Retain $rac{1}{2}$ a cup of oil in the pot. Add in the ground ingredients, tomato paste, lemon grass and fry till oil emerges on top.
- 4. Then add in the tamarind juice, salt and sugar to taste and continue to fry for a further 5 minutes.
- 5. Lastly add in the chicken pieces, kaffir lime leaves and Vietnamese coriander leaves.

Exploring the game of Bridge and our club's recent successes





















A night to remember: Halloween & Oktoberfest Nite Party at the Oval Kiara


